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What's Happening in Specials?

Music

5th-8th grade is learning about the history of music theater as well as working in groups to create their own musical materials including set diagrams, costume design, and scene writing. K-2nd is learning about rhythm and will be performing rhythms on instruments, through body movement, and singing. 3rd and 4th grade are learning about the musical alphabet, the treble clef staff, and intervals in relation to major and minor scales.

PE

Wow, that first quarter flew by so fast! We hope everyone had a fantastic break and look forward to beginning quarter number two! A big welcome to our new 5th-8th graders to PE for the second quarter and we look forward to continuing to work with all of our K-4 classes 1-2 days per week. We are very excited to begin using our Rock Wall that was installed at the end of last school year. Thank you to our front office staff for going through all of the permission slips during the first quarter to be sure students have the proper permissions to participate in Wall Activities. If your student(s) does not have a permission slip turned in they will be given an alternate activity to participate in on days where the class is on the Rock Wall. We have a traverse, or horizontal, climbing wall in which students climb across the wall, from one end to the other, rather than up to the top. Rock climbing is both an aerobic and anaerobic activity. It increases cardiovascular fitness, while simultaneously increasing muscle strength and endurance. When climbing, students are reaching for various hand and foot holds, requiring balance, coordination, flexibility and motor planning.



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Art

In art this month classes will be beginning new and exciting projects! 7th and 8th graders will be working towards creating and sewing their own book based on their family/culture! We will explore Watercolor and marking making in the upcoming weeks. 5th and 6th Graders are participating in the Laveen Lions Club Peace Poster contest being held throughout the district! This year's theme is *Dare To Dream*. In 4th grade we will be continuing the discussion on types of balance in art, moving onto using asymmetrical balance in their own artwork. 3rd grade will begin transitioning from creating patterns into creating movement with patterns in art. Kindergarten - 2nd grade are moving into the world of shapes, geometric and organic, and discovering what can be made with shapes!

In art club, 2nd-8th grade students are creating artwork to submit to the first ever Arizona School Board Association art contest! The theme of the artwork submitted is *Unleash your Imagination*. Students will be asked to title their artworks and give a brief explanation explaining their work with their submission. Students have been working on projects while at club and at home!



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Spanish

In November, Kindergarten will work on learning how to express likes and dislikes. 1st grade will work on learning the days of the week and the months of the year. 2nd grade will work on acquiring new vocabulary related to food. After learning the subject pronouns in Spanish, 3rd grade will work on conjugating and using verb ser in order to describe people. 4th grade is currently working on verb conjugations and will continue practicing during November. 5th grade will be working on Unit 2, Corre. 6th grade will finish Unit 7 and will start working on Unit 8, La comida Latina. Finally, 7/8 grade will start Unit 23, El Camino de Santiago.

Your child may qualify for free or reduced-price meal benefits. We strongly encourage parents & guardians to apply online through EZMealApp.com to ensure a quick, safe, and contact-less application process. Applications must be submitted annually and may take up to 10 business days to process.

Please make sure that your child's emergency and health form is up-to-date. This provides the school with important information in case an emergency should arise. I encourage parents to speak with the Health Associate if your child has any medical needs or concerns.

TAXPAYERS CAN LOWER THEIR TAXES AND SUPPORT OUR STUDENTS!

You can send all your state taxes to the State of Arizona or make a contribution to a public school and receive a State Income Tax Credit for up to \$200 for tax payers who file a tax return as single or head of household and a maximum of \$400 for married couples filing jointly on your State Income Tax Return.

A.R.S. §43-1089.01 gives you this opportunity to help your local school. A tax credit, which is the dollar-for-dollar reduction of your tax liability, is better than a tax deduction, which only reduces your taxable income before taxes are computed. The tax credit is available to all Arizona taxpayers, regardless of whether they have children in school.
